☞ Mark that this class adopts the method of “flipped learning,” which means you have to preview the class materials by watching the class video before you come to class and participate in the discussion and problem-solving activities in class.

☞ The course contents and the schedule are subject to change in consideration of the class population and the students’ needs and interests. Any such changes will be announced in class; it is the student’s responsibility to keep up with changes.

☛ **Attendance:** Class attendance is important to success in this course. The instructor reserves the right to lower final grades for poor attendance – if you are absent from class more than *1/3 of the whole class times*, it will result in failure of the course. You will get -0.5 point per absence and three cases of negligence (coming late or leaving earlier) equal one absence. If you are constantly late for class or leave class early (10min-rule!), it will downgrade your final grade for course. On the other hand, you will benefit from good attendance/participation when you are on the border between grading categories.

☛ **Quizzes** are given during the class meeting time. There will be no makeups for quizzes. *Among the quiz/HW scores, the lowest one will be dropped.*

☛ **Homework assignments:** Homework consists of syntactic problem sets, which challenge your analytical and critical mind.

❖ **Assignments must be turned in on time** (The deadline for each assignment will be given in class). Your homework assignment will be graded on the scale of 10. If you submit an assignment one class late, you won’t get more than 7 points. If you submit it later than that, you’ll get no more than 5 points.

❖ **If you are unable to be in class for any reason**, you may email your homework assignment to the instructor so you will not lose points for not submitting it on time. You are still responsible for printing out a paper copy and giving it to the instructor the next time you’re in class. Otherwise, you’ll not receive any point for that homework.

• **Exams** (Midterm; Final): The midterm and final exams are given on the 8th and 15th week, respectively. Please mark the exam dates in your calendar. The exam question types will be announced on the course web before the exam dates.

☐ **Makeups for the exam** (midterm or final) will be given only in case of emergency. If you must miss an exam, notify the instructor as quickly as possible either by email (yyrran77@gmail.com) or by speaking to her beforehand. If you have a prolonged illness or other problems that prevent you from attending class for more than 2 weeks in a row, please discuss this with the instructor.
